

Craig is fascinated by how we as men portray ourselves on dating sites - how we wish to be perceived, what extremes we go to, our egos, narcissism, the stories we tell (and lies), the superficiality, the 'choose me, I'm Mr Right or Mr Rightnow'. His portraits and figurative work look at these subjects. Some of the images have usernames from dating site profiles. He calls the group of work 'Mercurial Men' as the subjects look shiny, reflective, metallic (often corroded) but also fluid and there seems to be something bubbling below the surface, changes taking place. Also that mercury is toxic. Gods or monsters? Reality or illusion?

The Art of Paul Chisholm is a conundrum, it is at once pleasing to the eye, but also disturbing at the same time. Many juxtaposed colours, objects and texts proliferate out of the everyday and extraordinary materials the artist utilizes in each of his works.

Touching on issues of health, life, sex, death, war, relationships, human emotions and the world as a contemporary fleeting moment, the artist seeks us to ask what is important in our lives and how we all have the power for change; even when obstacles seem insurmountable.

His sculptures are at first glance playful and childlike but with further investigation each work has serious undertones of a world struggling to deal with its own ideologies. To each statement said there is always someone who will agree or disagree just to play ones devils advocate. And the same goes for the works of this young artist each work plays against the other in a game of kiss and tell, to reveal to the viewer what is necessary and for what is to be seeped out of these mysterious and intriguing objects.

Life for humans is far from perfect one may say we are living in Hell and are far from the pure and perfect world some would like us to believe we are living... I think the same goes for Chisholm's art works; are we entering a fantasy land of playful fun or a more sinister laboratory of man's making...

Paul Chisholm's work takes his experience as gay man living in a post 1980's society where HIV and AIDS is no longer the death sentence it once was but still has as many social, political and devastating effects o society. His work takes the complex emotions of human existence and reworks them to shed a positive light on what would normally be a painful emotion.

To be a Gay Artist in a modern western world we still have so much left to fight for in terms of acceptance and equality however in other country's such as Jamaica and Uganda Gay people still have even more to contend with. This is where the Artists project "IAM NOT AN ABOMINATION" hopes to play a part. He has created a limited edition Tote Bag and an endless supply of badges which are available by emailing the artist at his website.



IS WORK HAS FOR SOME TIME ENGAGED WITH THE THEME OF MEMORY AND LOSS. HE SPENT A YEAR COLLECTING OBJECTS, INFORMATION AND IMAGERY BASE ON THE IDEA OF GAY MEN AND THE MILITARY. THE FIRST WORLD WAR WAS TIME WHEN BEING GAY WAS A COVERT PRACTICE. MEN FROM SMALL COMMUNITIES OFTEN JOIN THE MILITARY AS AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE IN THE COMPANY OF OTHER MEN. MEN IN THE MILITARY FOUND LOVE, LIFELONG FRIENDSHIPS AND HEARTACHE. IN RESEARCHING THE THEME HE CAME ACROSS TOUCHING STORIES THAT FILLED THE WORK WITH A KIND OF MELANCHOLY.

The work emerged as a series of moving animated boxes filled with found objects, imagery and even video, which sought to document and suggest the hidden nature of gay men and gay sexuality at this period in time. Little visual documented evidence of gay life at this time exists and the work is intended to illustrate possibilities rather than factual connections.

THE SERIES OF ROUND PRINTS RETURNING HEROES WAS THE FINAL PART OF THE COLLECTED WORKS AND SYMBOLICALLY CELEBRATES THOSE LOVES, LIVES AND MEN WHO SUFFERED THE SHACKLES OF HIDDEN IDENTITY.



















IN HIS EXPLORATION OF THE HUMAN FORM, PEREZ TAKES INSPIRATION
